#### Course Objectives

This programme is jointly organised by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the Infocomm Development Authority (IDA) of Singapore. The programme will cover Singapore's infocommunications media regulatory landscape, telecommunications competition and resource management. Participants will also have opportunities to interact with senior infocommunications media policy and regulatory experts.

#### Terms of Award

The course is sponsored by the Government of Singapore under the Singapore Cooperation Programme Training Award and the Small Island Developing States Technical Cooperation Programme.

Under this programme arrangement, the Government of Singapore will bear the following expenses for the successful applicants (thereafter known as participants) during their training in Singapore. These expenses include:

- . A daily training allowance of One Hundred and Twenty Singapore Dollars (S\$120) from first day to last day of the course to cover meals and daily expenses. [Complimentary breakfast is provided in the hotel from the first day to one day after the course];
- . Transportation to course venue and site visits;
- . Medical insurance for participants to cover accident and hospitalisation during their stay in Singapore in accordance with the policy of a local insurance company; and
- . Accommodation for the entire duration of the course.

#### Requisitos:

##### Synopsis

By the end of the programme, participants will gain deeper insights on government policy-making and regulation in the converging Infocomm Media landscape in Singapore.

Topics to be covered include:

- . Singapore's Infocomm Media journey towards a Smart Nation;
- . Regulating a competitive telecommunications and media sector;
- . Managing Scarce Resources, including Spectrum Management;
- . Internet-related policies, including Net Neutrality and Zero-Rating;
- . Convergence issues, including Over the Top Services;
- . Broadcasting issues; and
- . Cybersecurity.

##### Methodology

The 5-day course will be conducted by senior Singapore government policy and regulatory practitioners and industry experts who will share their experiences and conduct discussions together with participants.

Besides formal lecturing, programme activities include open discussions, small group session for participants to share their regulatory experience in their respective countries, case studies, regulatory clinics and external site visit. The programme also includes social events to facilitate networking amongst participants.

##### Application Information

Applicants should be:

- . Senior government officials with at least 5 years of related experience in ICT, Telecom and/or Media regulation fields;
- . Nominated by their respective Governments;
- . Proficient in written and spoken English; and
- . In good health.
